

TennisWorks

Our free TennisWorks program provides accessible and high-quality programming that supports the physical, mental, social, and emotional well-being of youth with less access to opportunities.



TENNISWORKS ACADEMY LAUNCHED IN 2022

Deep relationships with students and families helps ensure our programming meets the evolving needs of our community. During the three-week MPS labor strike, FWTEC offered a day program for students to have a safe and accessible location to be together, understand and process emotions, and have a physical outlet through tennis.

This extra time together and the increased awareness of challenges facing our students prompted the creation of TennisWorks Academy (TWA), a free tennis and educational enrichment summer camp. In the first year, TWA sparked curiosity and a renewed joy of learning through interactive field trips and engaging educational activities while deepening relationships and a sense of community.





FWTEC provides our students with a unique, fun experience to try a lifelong sport, along with the inspiration to live an active lifestyle. Their coaches foster a strong sense of teamwork and community.

Susie Neet

Susie is a native of Minneapolis who has volunteered for more than 30 years in our tennis community. She

was our very first volunteer in 2003 with Girls Squad and after-school programs for under-represented students from local schools. Susie retired in 2002, after teaching grade school for 34 years.. In 2013, she was inducted into the USTA Northern Hall of Fame. Susie's personality, spirit, and wisdom has influenced so many.



Jo Batty-George

Jo consistently volunteered with the FWTEC Girls Squad program every Tuesday and Thursday night. While she filled the

courts with laughter, her real superpower was working with the girls off the court. Jo listened to all the girls and helped them navigate the bumpy journey through middle and high school. She

passed away in February 2022, but will always be remembered for her huge heart and ability to always find time for anyone who needed support.



Jeanne Lacy

Jeanne started volunteering with Girls Squad in 2005 and became known as our Crafty Youth Mentor. Her

projects allowed time for conversation to flow, and she would lead or listen depending on the situation. Both her daughters, Rasheeda and Milliecia, progressed through the program as tennis players, and both served as tennis captains for their high school teams. Our staff, coaches and players are so lucky for her work with Girls Squad.



Linda Langeness

Linda began working for Fred Wells in 1968 at his family-owned business,

the Peavey Company. At the Fred Wells

Tennis & Education Center, Linda served on the Board of Directors from 2001-2009, and was the Business Manager from 2002-2013. She did everything behind the scenes to keep the lights on and ensure Fred's vision stayed a reality. She continued working for Fred in various jobs until his passing in 2005. Since 1992, Linda has worked for the Wells Family Foundation.



Dan Shannon

Dan worked alongside Fred Wells for six years before our doors officially opened in 2002. He served

as Vice President of Tennis and Education, Inc. (our former legal name) from 1996-2002 and was the first Executive Director from 2002-2006. He stayed involved as a Board Chair until 2009, and a Board Member until 2014. He continued impacting lives in the Twin Cities by joining the Pine Tree Apple Tennis Classic Tournament Advisory Board and serving as a Player Liaison. Dan has been instrumental in the growth of FWTEC from the very beginning.




